Libraries - More Than Just Books!

Literacy goes beyond books and that includes the services that libraries offer. Libraries are free and they all want you to come in to use their services. You can find all sorts of resources at your local library. These can include classes, homework help, career development, meeting rooms, social events, art experiences, meal services, equipment rentals and of course many technology related services.

Computers


Stop in for free Wi-Fi! You can use your own device or take advantage of the computer labs. Library computers have access to web browsers, Microsoft (Word, Excel, PowerPoint) and databases for researching.

Printing and More

Most libraries have low-cost printing/copying and free scanning/faxing. Check online or call ahead to see what to expect for these services before you go.

Assistive Technology

Everyone has different needs when it comes to understanding the world of technology. Many libraries have different accessible options for software and devices. Reach out to the libraries near you to see if they have options like screen readers, text-to-speech, communication devices, audio recorders or braille.



Specialty Devices

Every library is different so you may find technology like 3D printers, large scale scanners, laminators, video equipment, sewing machines and sometimes advanced software on the computers.

Classes

Find classes on using email, Google Drive, Microsoft programs, browsing the internet, computers, smartphones and tablets. You can also get assistance with finding a job, resume building or understanding healthcare systems. Also, certain Ramsey County locations offer classes using Northstar Digital Literacy a program of Literacy Minnesota.

Librarians

The people who work at libraries are there to help. Don't be afraid to ask them questions. You never know what you may find out!

NDIA's Important Words

Digital Equity

A condition in which all individuals and communities have the information technology capacity needed for full participation in our society, democracy and economy. Digital Equity is necessary for civic and cultural participation, employment, lifelong learning, and access to essential services. Sometimes called TEQuity/Tech Equity which is the shortening of technology equity.

Digital Literacy

The ability to use information and communication technologies to find, evaluate, create, and communicate information, requiring both cognitive and technical skills.

Digital Navigators

Trusted guides who assist community members with ongoing, individualized support for accessing affordable and appropriate connectivity, devices, and digital skills.
