WHY LITERACY?

- Functional literacy is critical for navigating the workforce, advocating for oneself and fulfilling basic needs.
- Of all adults in the United States, more than half (54%) read below a sixth-grade literacy level and nearly one in five (about 43 million Americans) read below the third-grade level, which means they can do no more than read simple, short texts when locating information.¹
- Children of parents with low literacy are **10 times more likely** to be at the lowest literacy levels themselves, making them more likely to struggle in class or drop out of school.²
- There are 9,883,443 unemployed individuals in the United States³, of which at least 3,261,536 lack foundational digital skills.⁴ These individuals may not even begin to compete for an estimated 6,925,017 or 75.2% of job openings which require such skills.⁵
- Parents who gain written and digital literacy skills are more likely to positively influence their children's academic achievement, **helping to break cycles of poverty**.

Our Open Door campuses and satellite sites in Minneapolis and Saint Paul offer free adult basic-skills classes led by staff and trained volunteers.

3,325 national educators-both volunteers and staffattended 105 Literacy Minnesota led tutortraining webinars. We are the national thought leader in literacy resources. 6,236 documents and teaching tools were downloaded from our online Educator Resources Library between July 2022 and June 2023.

27 National Service partnerships

Our AmeriCorps Literacy Leaders developed 27 local and national partnerships in addition to the annual Summer Reads members serving in the Twin Cities and greater Minnesota. 584K+ Northstar certificates

Digital literacy learners earned 584,504 certificates through our Northstar Digital Literacy platform last year, giving them a way to demonstrate computer skills to potential employers.
