This resource was created by Summer Reads VISTA members. Summer Reads is an AmeriCorps VISTA national service program of Literacy Minnesota. For 8 weeks over the summer, Summer Reads VISTA members volunteer full-time as children's/youth literacy mentors in schools, libraries and out-of-school-time programs across Minnesota. They bring literacy to life for low-income students through a variety of activities – one-on-one tutoring, creative enrichment activities like using arts and drama to explore language or practicing vocabulary and comprehension in science and other subjects. They also connect students and parents/caregivers to community resources through wrap-around basic needs support. At the same time, the VISTA members build their own leadership, explore career paths, pay for college and become lifelong advocates for the communities they serve due to the power of their experience. www.literacymn.org/summerreads





LEARN at the Library!



Fine Free

The library is now fine free. That's right! We no longer charge fines on late items. This ensures that all people have access to library books and materials, which is our primary purpose as a public library. Learn more about this new policy and how it affects you.

Early Learning at the Library

Every day, families visit the library to connect with resources and activities that promote early learning. From storytimes in nine different languages, to weekly puppet shows at George Latimer Central Library, to interactive spaces that encourage hands-on play and our summer reading program, Summer Spark — the library is a great resource for families.

Homework Help

The library provides tutors, computers, Wi-Fi, printers, reference books, and school supplies to help students of all ages at six library locations. In addition to Homework Centers, the library's <u>Reading</u> <u>Together</u> program provides reading mentoring for students grades 1-5.

Createch is a creative space for teens, located at five Saint Paul Public Library locations and at Saint Paul Neighborhood Network. At Createch, teens can access tools needed to pursue interests and spark new passions, and be encouraged by mentors who support their individual growth.

Summer Spark

Summer Spark encourages kids to have fun, stay active, and keep learning all summer long. Join in the fun by attending free programs at your library and earning prizes by completing reading and activity challenges! Summer Spark kicks off on June 1 every year.

Hands-on Activities for Kids

The library offers maker programming for kids throughout the year, including two flagship programs for the very young: Mini Masterpieces and Kaleidoscope. During school breaks, the library offers Maker Break programming for kids ages 7-11, and Maker Camps during the summer.

Nature Smart Libraries

The Nature Smart Library initiative provides resources, programming, and access for youth to interact with nature in their neighborhoods. Four Nature Smart Library locations — Hamline Midway, Riverview, Saint Anthony Park, and Sun Ray — offer Nature Smart backpacks to check out with books and activities on selected themes such as monarchs, trees, and birds.

Teens Know Best

The Teens Know Best (TKB) book club is for teens 12-18 who want to read and review young adult (YA) books that aren't available to the public yet. YA Publishers read TKB member reviews and use them to influence their future decisions. Offered at Dayton's Bluff library every month.
